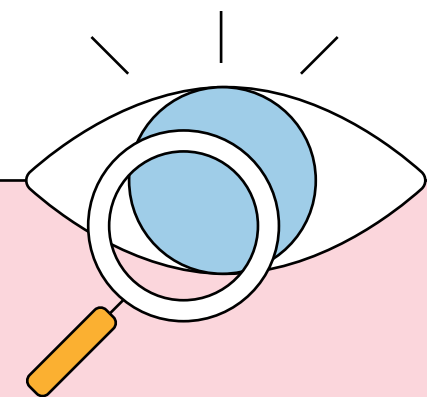

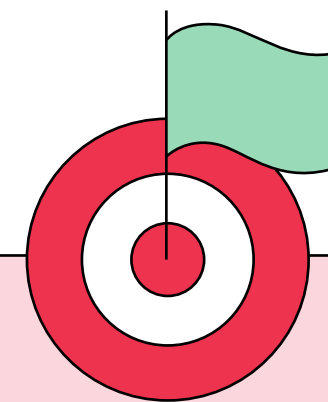
The International Fair Play Passport—Olympia Club is a new innovative educational program that uses sport as a universal language to promote values, teamwork, and global citizenship.

The International FairPlay Passport (IFPP) was born in Olympia in 2023 and has its permanent headquarters in the Municipality of Ancient Olympia. The IFPP, in agreement with Health Entropy Projects, has established a non-profit organization that promotes personal and social well-being through community programs that champion values and FairPlay, from sport to society.



OUR GOAL

To train a new generation of young ambassadors who embody fair play, creativity, and responsibility, thereby contributing to a culture of respect, peace, and global citizenship.



PROGRAM FOCUS

Excellence and Innovation. The program strives for excellence and innovation by integrating values, moral integrity, and respect as core behaviors in everyday life. It also fosters mental, physical, and social well-being, and promotes a healthy lifestyle.

GENERAL PURPOSE

To unite schools from diverse continents on an educational and cultural journey that promotes FairPlay as a way of life, through sport, creativity, and reflection.

To promote excellence, innovation, fairplay, and health in education using the universal language of sport.

OBJECTIVES

Promote Core Values

Advance the foundational values of Respect, Friendship, and Excellence, the pillars of both the Olympic Movement and FairPlay.

Develop Awareness

Cultivate an understanding of 12 key values (e.g., fair play, respect, solidarity, peace, inclusion, sustainability, health, safeguarding).

Foster Global Understanding

Encourage intercultural cooperation and understanding among young people worldwide.

Enable Application

Participants must be able to apply these values in all aspects of their lives.

Develop Ambassadors

Train participants as International FairPlay Ambassadors, capable of applying these values within their own lives, schools, and communities.

Grant Visibility

Link local actions to the International FairPlay Passport, providing global visibility and official certification.

2026 Pilot Program Details

PARTICIPANTS

Target Group

Students aged 12–18.

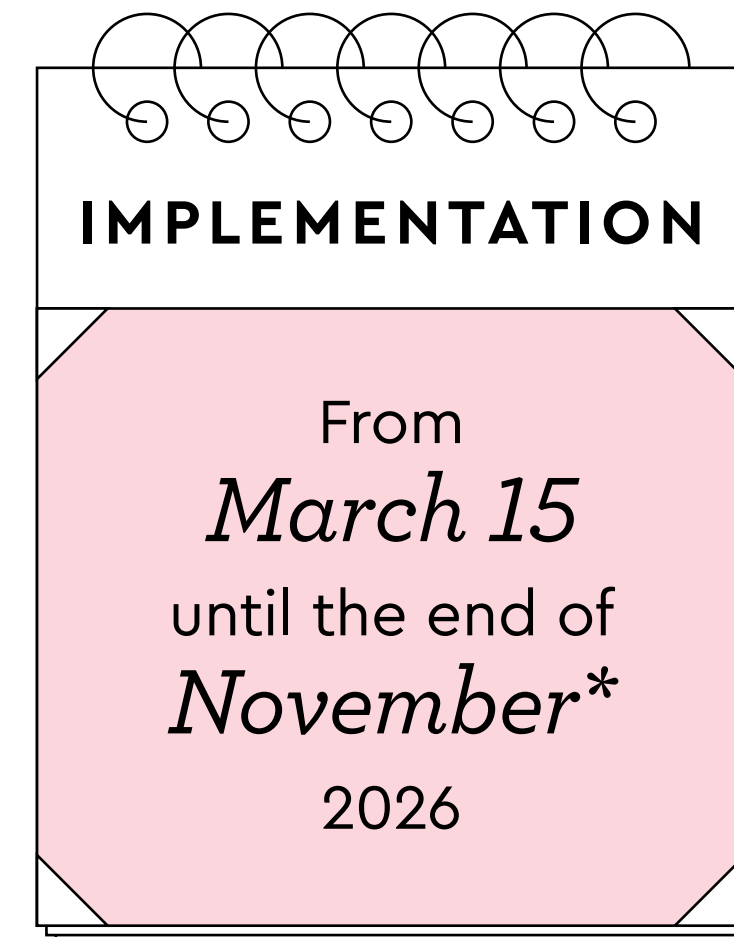
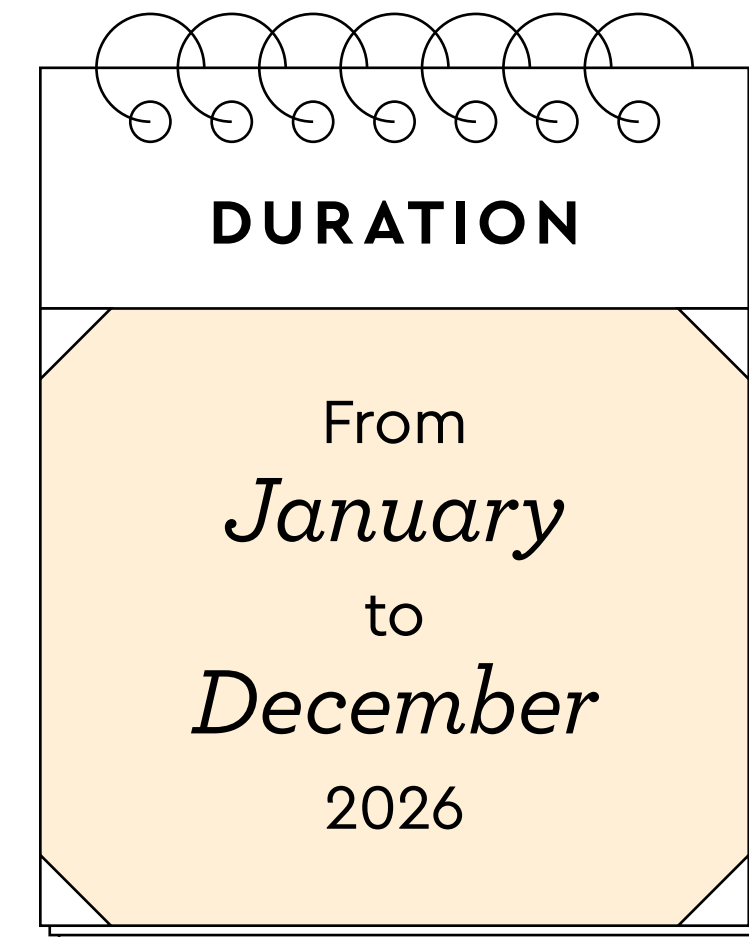
Engagement Model

Students are encouraged to become protagonists and active actors in their learning process, moving from spectators to participants. Teachers, facilitators, and educators guide the activities, while students take the lead on creative outputs.

International Network

Fifteen top schools (three from each continent) will pilot the program in 2026, with potential for expansion in subsequent years. All participating schools will join an international network of excellence and innovation.

TIMELINE & PHASES



*Accommodating the school calendars of each continent.

The program structure includes three key phases:

Preparation Phase

Includes selection of schools, training of educators, and planning of themes and activities.

Implementation Phase

Monthly or bimonthly activities focusing on one or more chosen values, adapted to local contexts. Activities may be virtual to ensure accessibility.

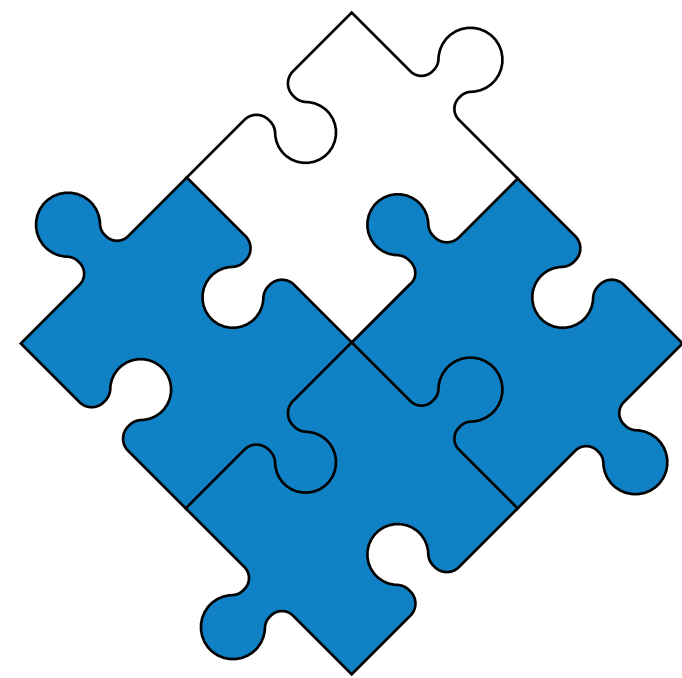
Evaluation Phase

Involves questionnaires, observations, and feedback to measure impact and ensure quality.

Flexibility & Adaptability

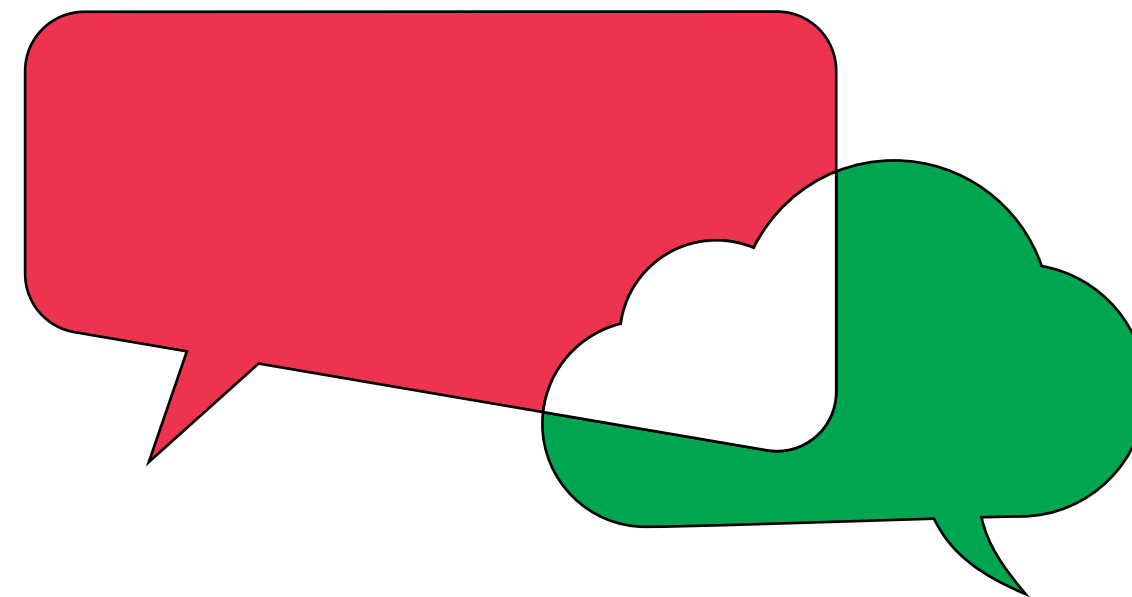
The program is designed for flexibility and adaptability to local cultural and learning needs. Each school tailors the program according to its own culture, learning style, school values, and curriculum.

The methodology combines active learning principles with the three key pillars of IFPP:



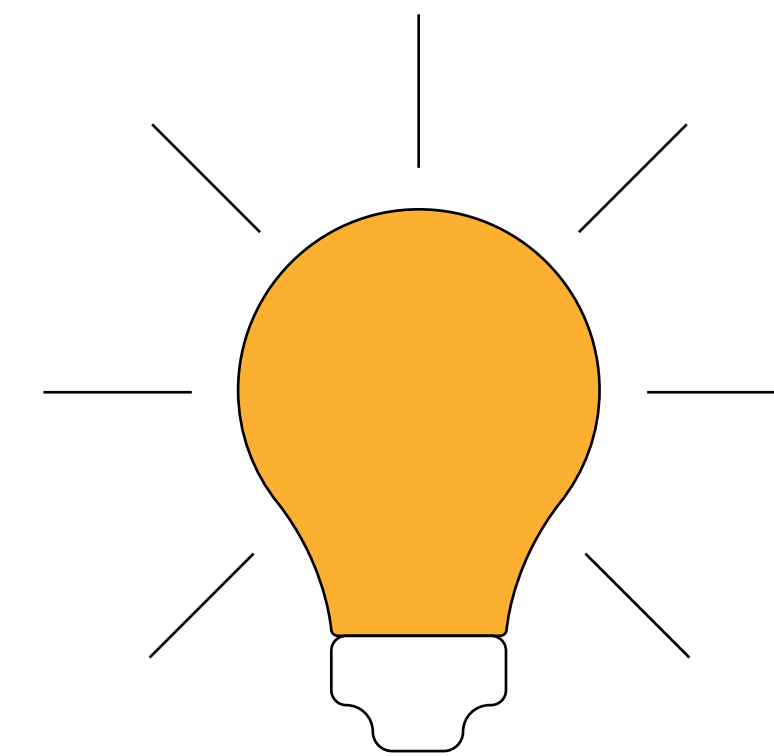

Every activity concludes with a tangible product that reflects the value(s) explored.



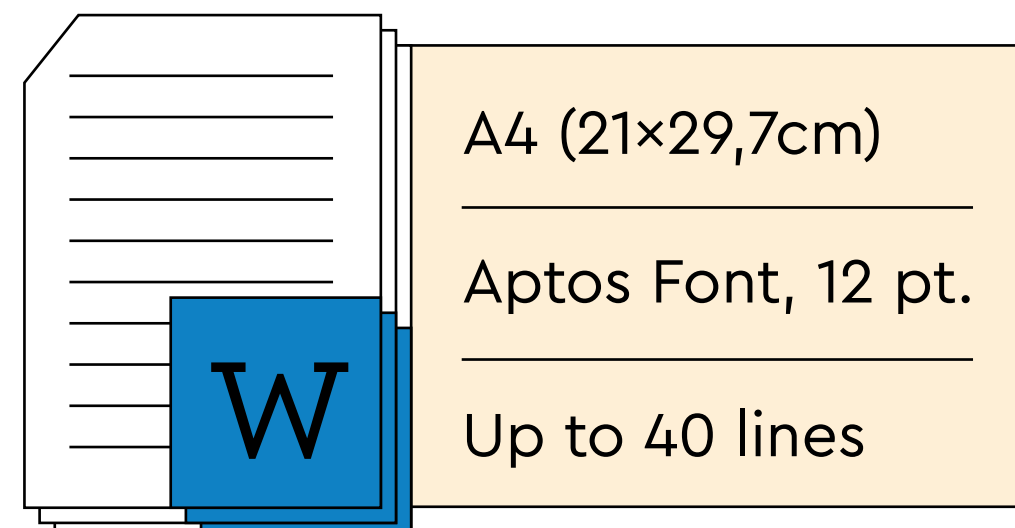
AI Future of Values

Main Product

A series of 6 to 12 short videos (maximum 2 minutes each), accompanying written reflections one page per value.



Up to 12 pages (A4 format, Aptos 12, up to 40 lines), and traditional games used to carry out the activities.



Additional Outcomes

Creative projects, traditional games related to Olympic values, lists of online resources, music, shared messages, and collaborative materials.

CERTIFICATION & CLOSING



Symbolic Closing

The program concludes with a final global event where each school receives the International FairPlay Passport, symbolizing its commitment to the universal values of respect, friendship, and excellence.

Collective Video

The 2026 program will culminate in a **collective video** titled, "**International FairPlay Passport: teenagers worldwide united for the future of sports values**".

Certification

All schools will be granted the title "International FairPlay Passport – Olympia Club" receive a special international diploma, and be twinned with Ancient Olympia. All participating teachers and students will receive the International FairPlay Passport.

NETWORKING & SUSTAINABILITY

An International FairPlay Passport Platform will serve as a common online space for schools to upload videos, reflections, and interact.

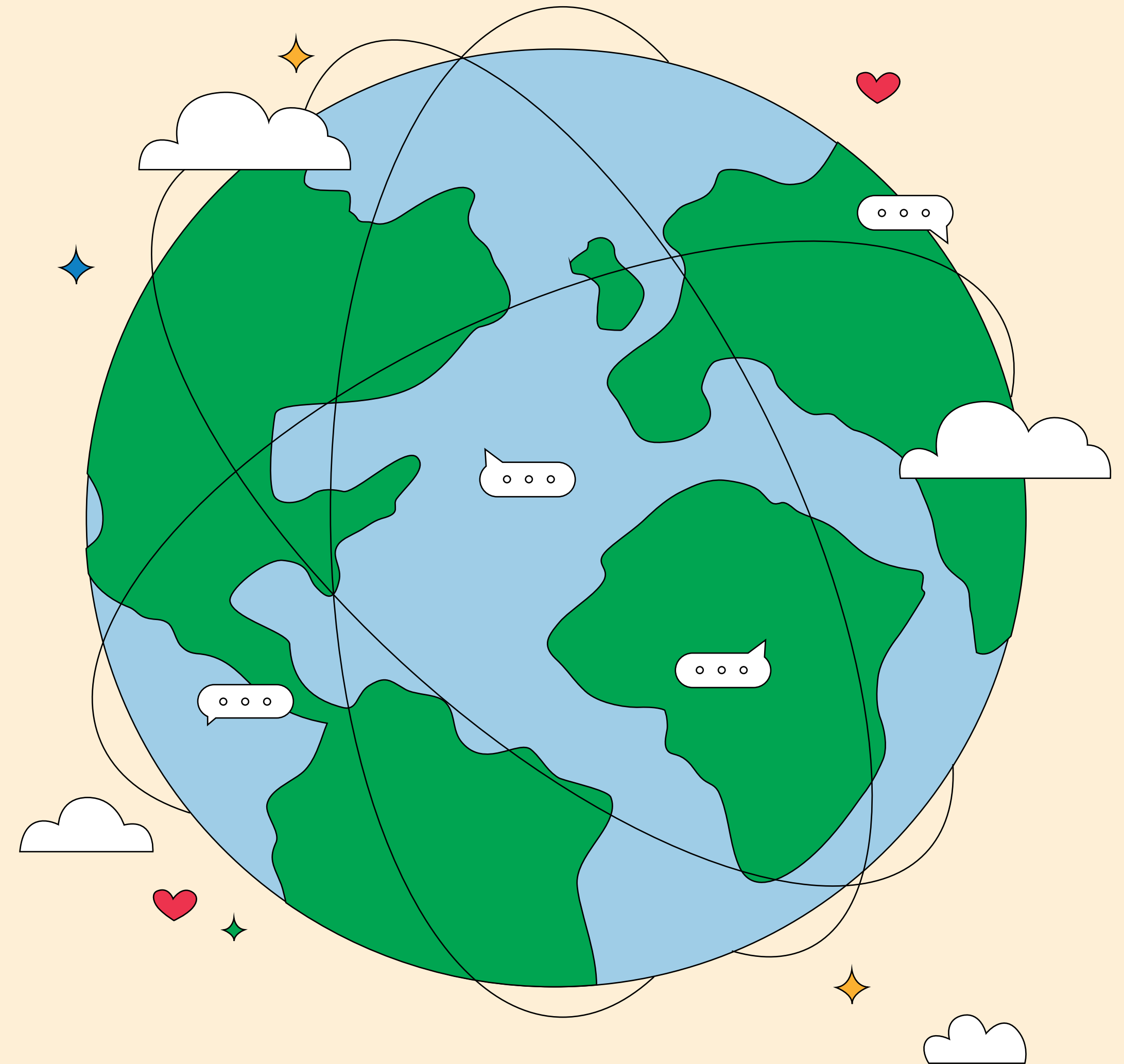

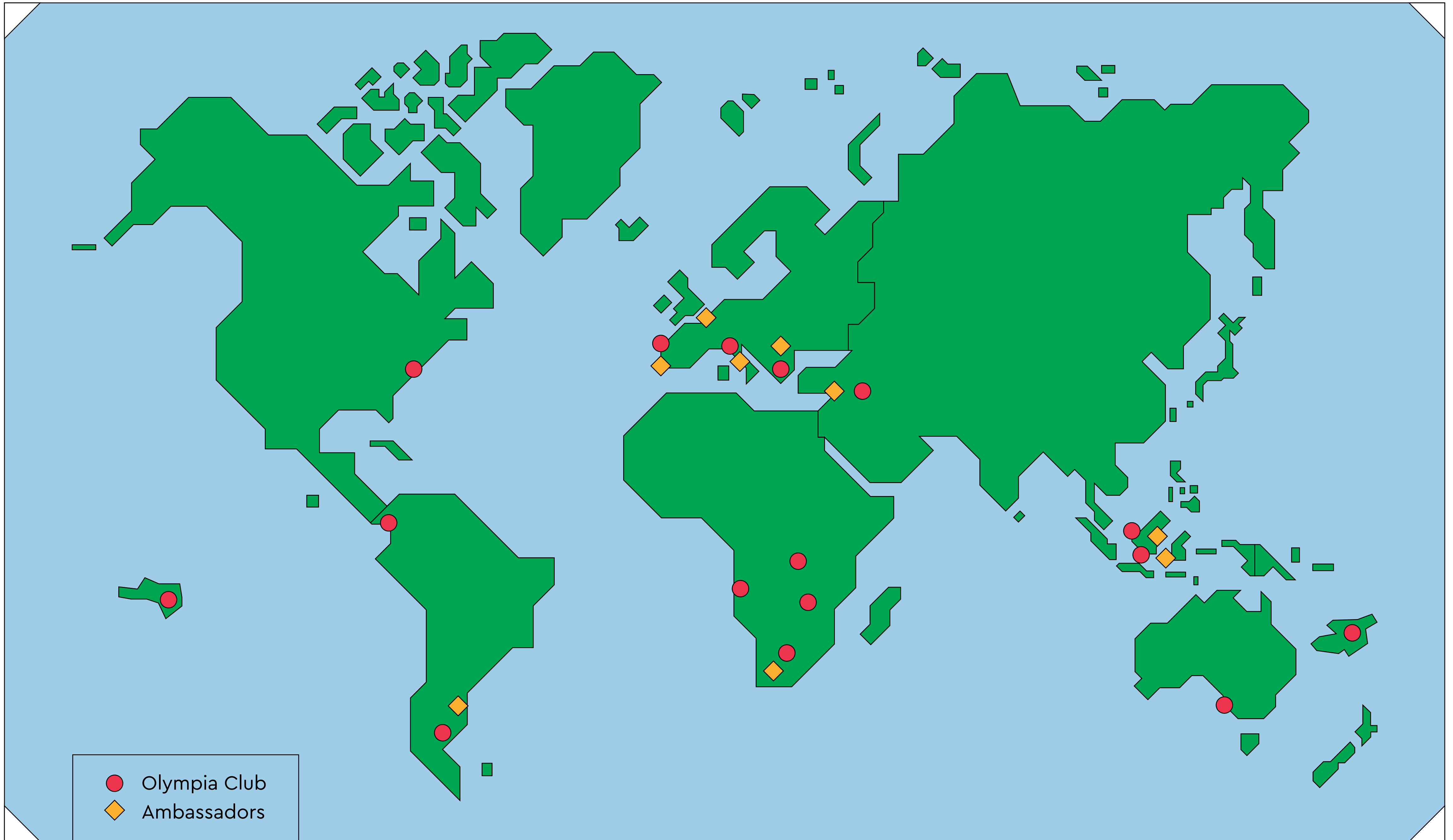

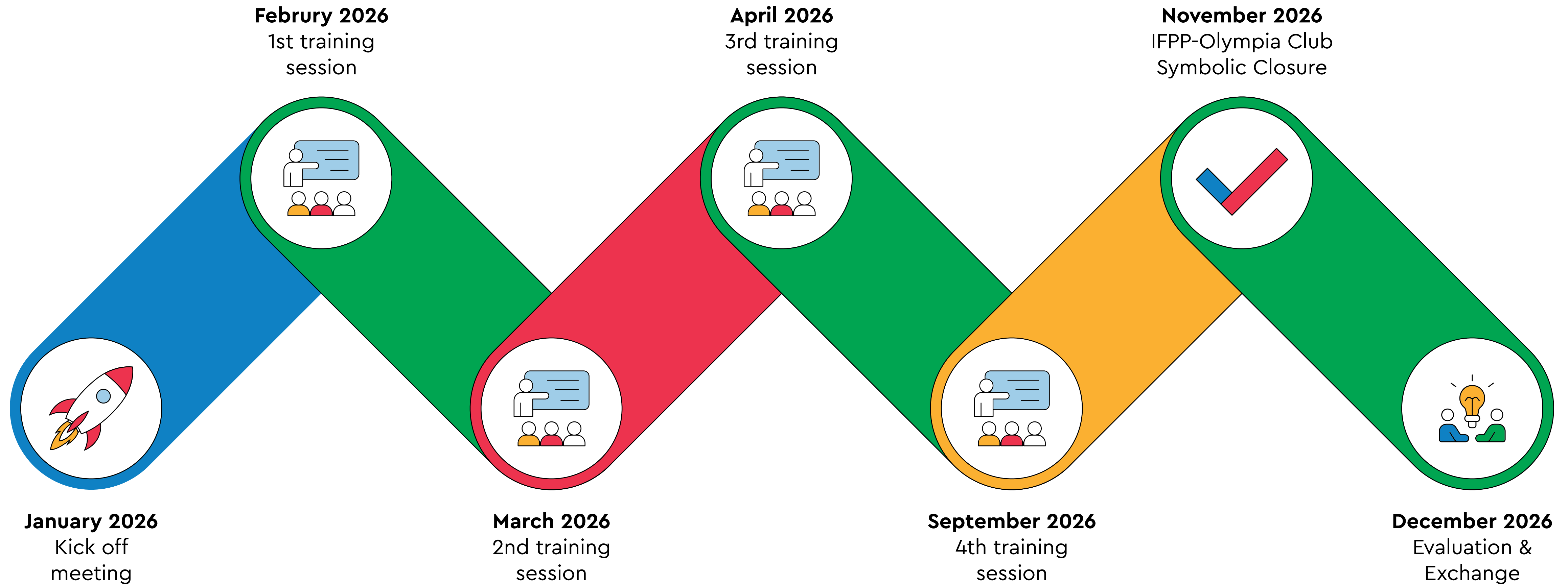
